 - Farm Ownership, Farm Operating, and Microloan with different terms
 - NOT 0% interest loans

Funding Resources - Grange

- Community organization with national, state, county, and community chapters. Foundations in modernizing agriculture.
- North Carolina's State Level Grange has \$25,000 per year available for Farm Development Grants
- Getting funds from your local Grange may be simpler than USDA or RAFI grants and require less reporting
- Requirements: be a member of your local Grange (\$25 annually) and make a short presentation to your local Grange about your project (Cooperative Extension can provide a template)

Funding Resources - State Cost Share

Durham Soil and Water Conservation District can help with some aspects of Hoophouses/High Tunnels.

- <u>Agriculture Economic Development Grant Program (AED)</u>: Cost Share grants towards producing local food, Ag development, outdoor environmental learning.
 School Grants: up to \$1,000, Farmer Grants: up to \$5,000
- Agriculture Cost Share Program (ACSP): For agricultural water quality
- **Agricultural Water Resource Assistance Program (AgWRAP**): For water quantity, such as increasing water use efficiency, storage, and availability
